Online Course: Introduction to Comprehensive Literacy Instruction: Version 2.0



Update to the original course!

The Introduction to Comprehensive Literacy Instruction online course focuses on practical aspects of comprehensive literacy instruction for children and adults with disabilities, including people who cannot rely on speech alone to be heard and understood (formerly known as complex communication needs).

Version 2.0 of the course addresses the same topics as the original, but with updated content to reflect new research and ongoing experience with implementation. The course takes approximately 7 hours to complete and a certificate of completion is provided.

The course is designed for anyone who is beginning on the journey to support one or more students with disabilities to improve their literacy skills using comprehensive literacy instruction, including teachers, education assistants, leadership teams, therapists and parents.
